## 2016 Highlights & Milestones

### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT & SELF-AGENCY

- Accepted 1st full-time woman resident
- Finalized programmatic development for residential program
- Hired new Executive Director, Elly Goetz
- Conducted recruiting in NC women's prisons and 4 partner organizations



### ADVOCACY & EDUCATION

- Held the 2017 South Eastern Social Care Farming Summit
- Received over 1300 volunteer hours by 240 community members
- Participated in 6 re-entry coalitions
- Launched state-wide letter writing campaign to incarcerated individuals, sending 85 letters

### SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS

- Launched our first CSA, selling 33 shares
- Started the Alamance County Tool Share program with the support of 10 local farms
- Generated \$8000 in farm sales
- Donated 1/4 of our produce to SAFE food pantry
- Produced over 2,000 pounds of vegetables
- Facilitated 3 mushroom log workshops
- Mentored 9 justice involved youth

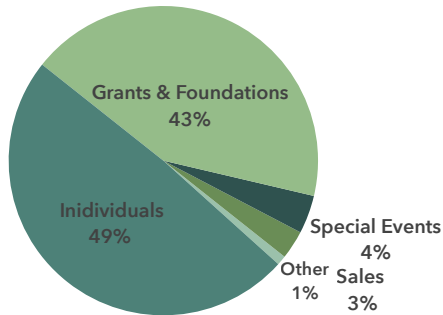

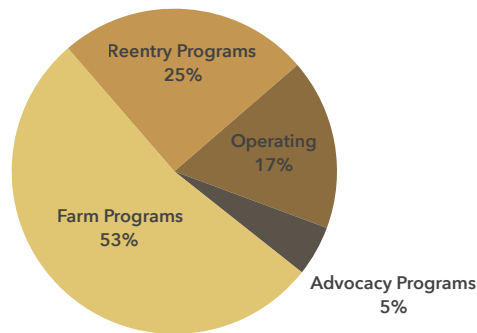
### TOOL SHARE MEMBER
